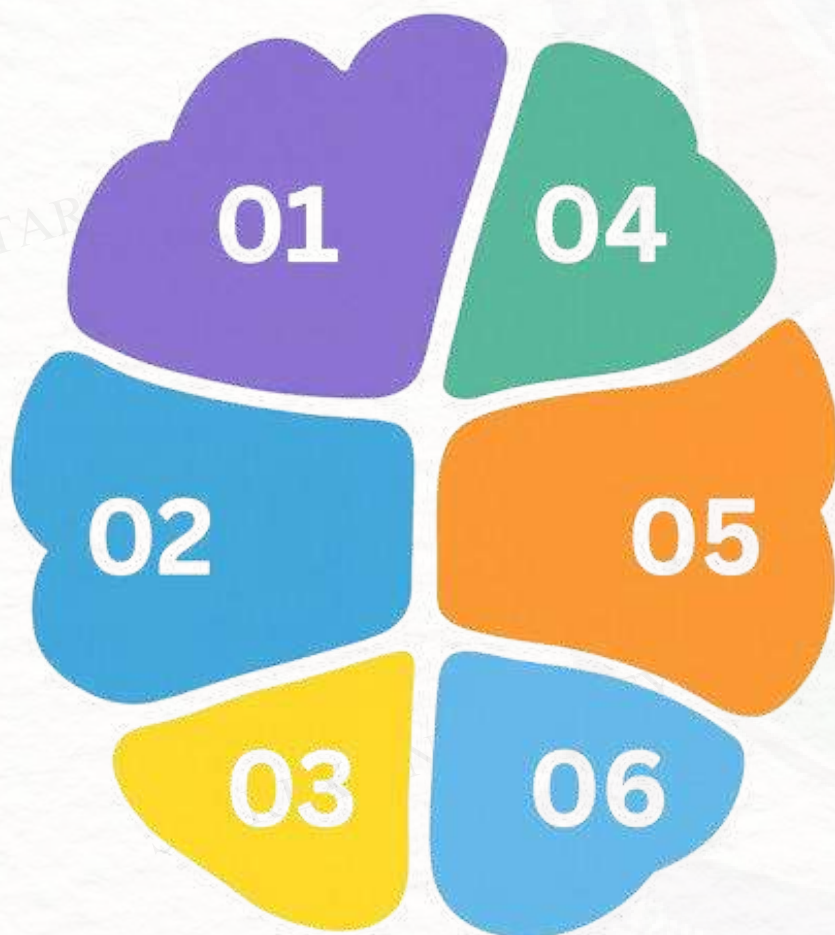

## **VISITOR**

The Hon'ble Governor of Haryana is the Visitor of the University.

02

## **CHANCELLOR**

The Chancellor of the University is appointed for a period of three years by the Sponsoring Body with the approval of the Visitor.

03

## **VICE CHANCELLOR**

The Vice Chancellor is appointed by the Chancellor, as per qualification prescribed by the University Grants Commission, subject to the provisions contained in sub-section 17 (1) and shall hold office for a term of three years or up to the age of 70 years, whichever is earlier, provided that after expiry of the term of 3 years, the Vice Chancellor shall be eligible for re-appointment for another term of 3 years.

## **REGISTRAR**

The appointment of Registrar is made by the Chairperson of the sponsoring body in a manner, as specified by the Statutes. The Registrar shall possess the qualifications prescribed by the University Grants Commission.

## **CHIEF FINANCE AND ACCOUNT OFFICER**

The Chief Finance and Account Officer is appointed by the Chancellor under Section 19(1) of the Act. He/She is the whole time salaried officer of the University.

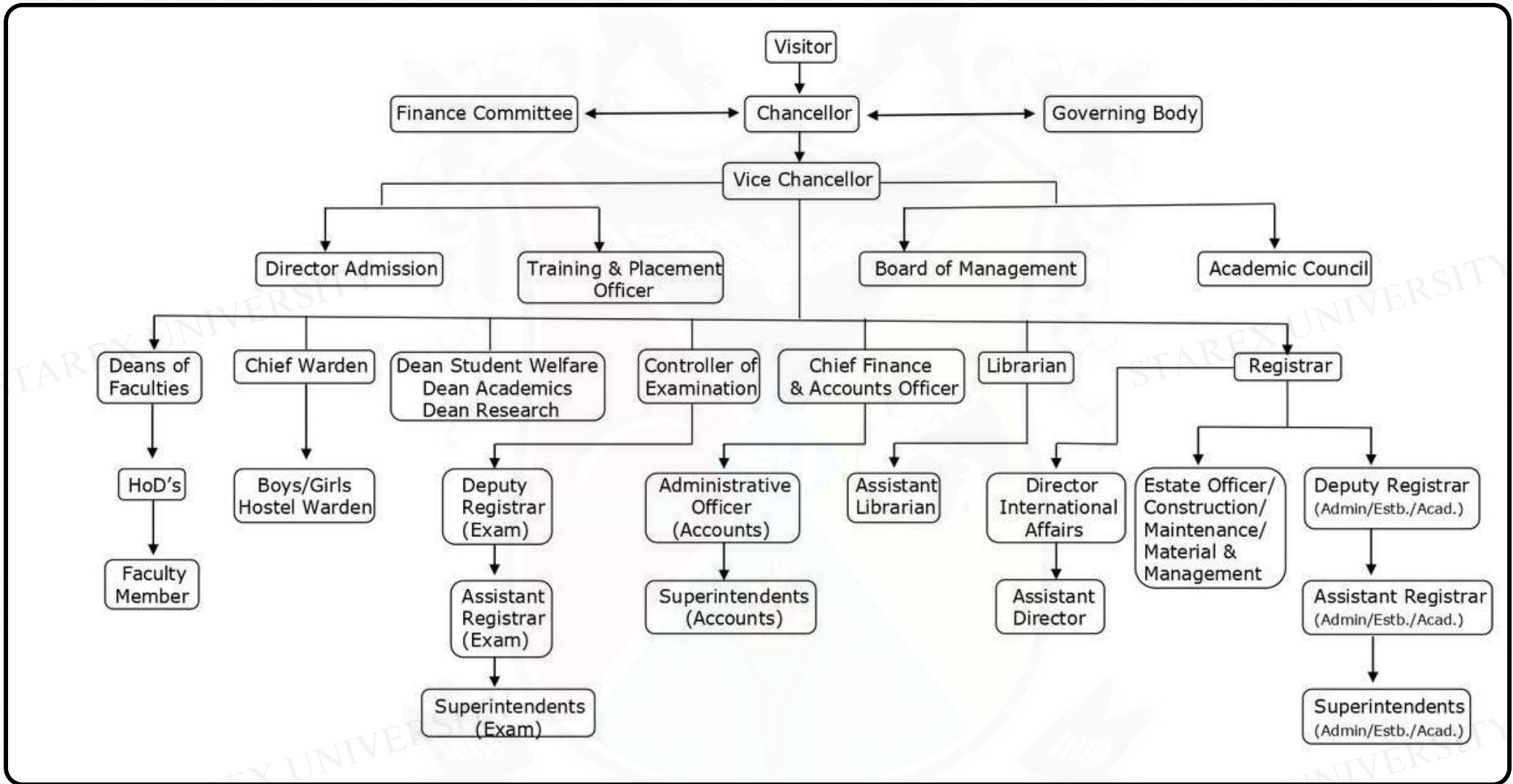

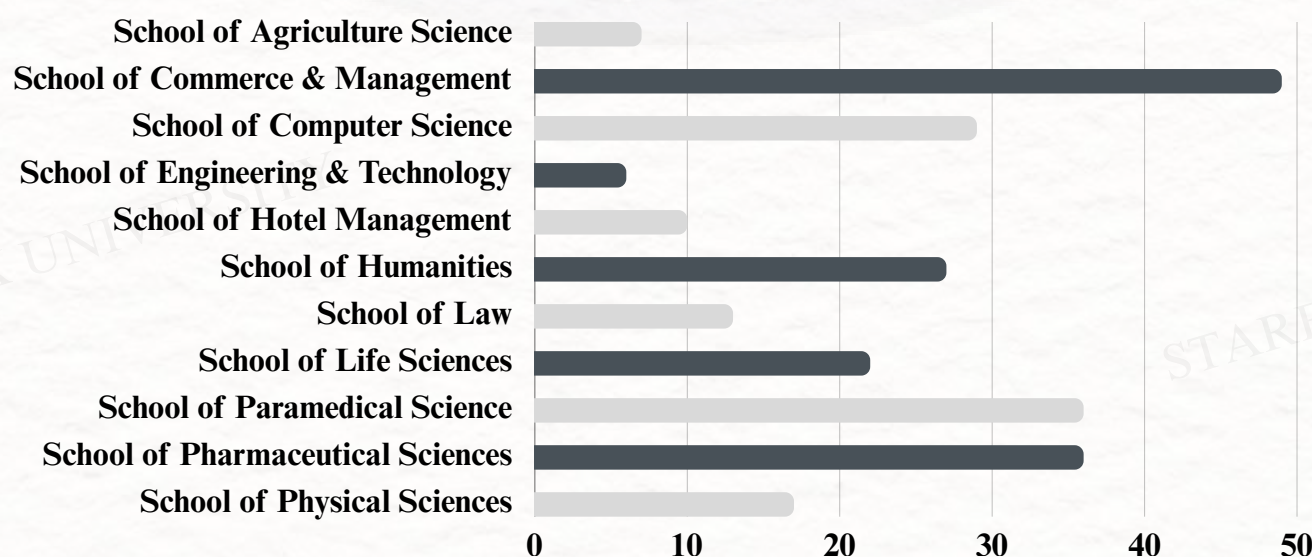
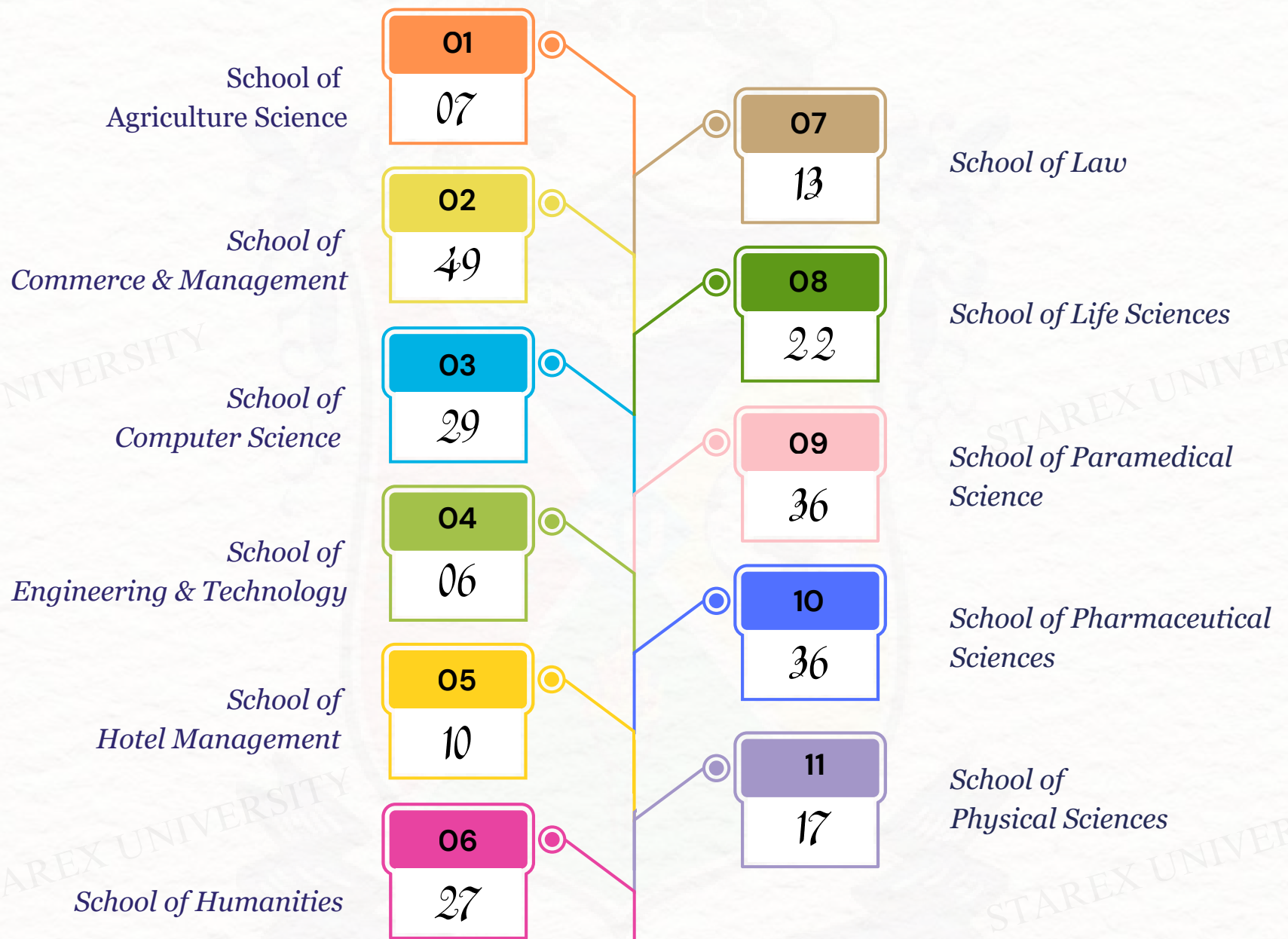

Along with the 11 Schools, the University also has a Starex College of Pharmacy.*

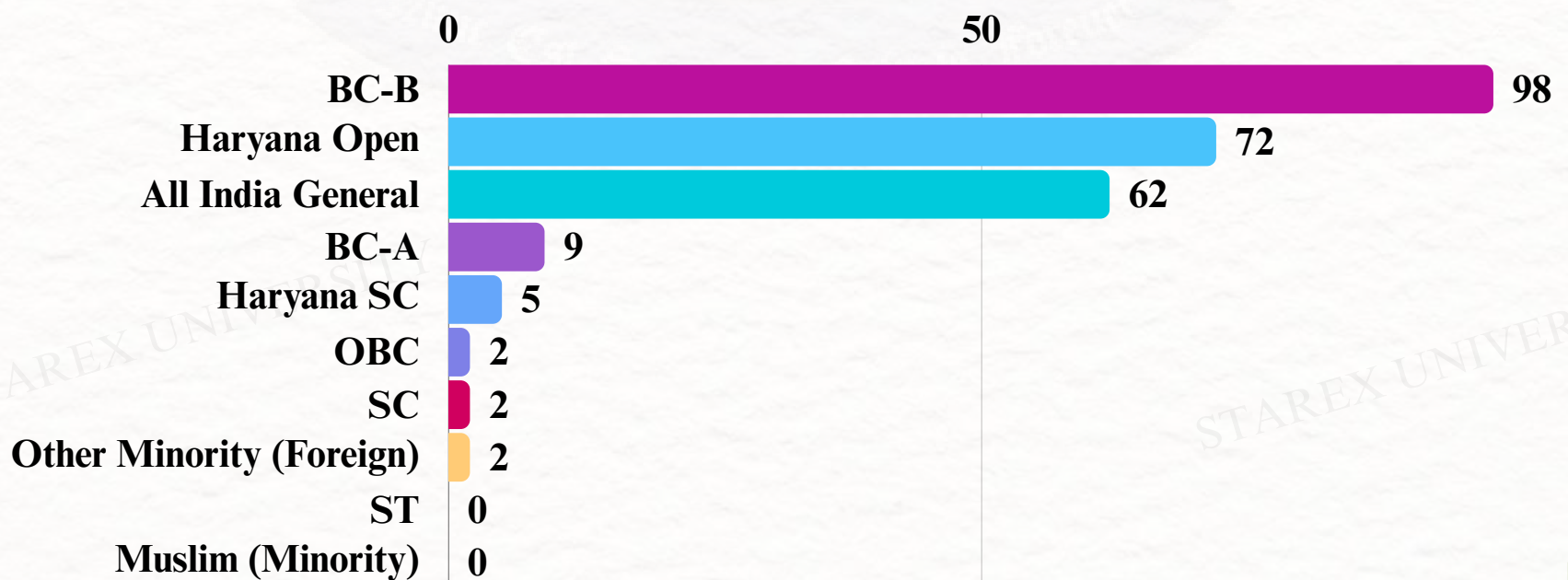
Figure : School Wise Enrolment (July 2024 - June 2025)

## School of Agriculture Science

B.Sc. Agriculture is 4 year undergraduate professional course divided into 8 semesters. The four-year program aims to provide related knowledge, practical skills, and competencies in agriculture. This degree prepares students for a wide range of careers related to the agriculture industry and other allied industries.

A student pursuing B.Sc.(Hons) Agriculture course will study a wide variety of subjects including agronomy, soil sciences, horticulture (fruit science & vegetable), plant breeding and genetics, entomology, plant pathology, animal sciences, extension education, plant biochemistry, agriculture economics, basics of biotechnology, etc. The syllabus is as per the guidelines of ICAR (Indian Council of Agriculture Research) and is designed to train the students to understand ways of improving the crop production in a sustainable manner and to provide overall knowledge related to agriculture and related disciplines.

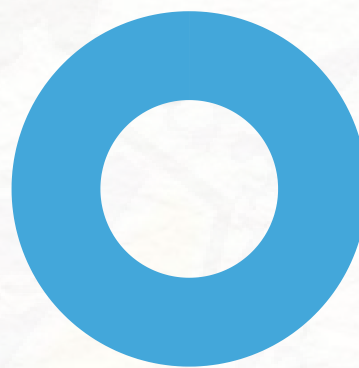

## Ph.D. Programme

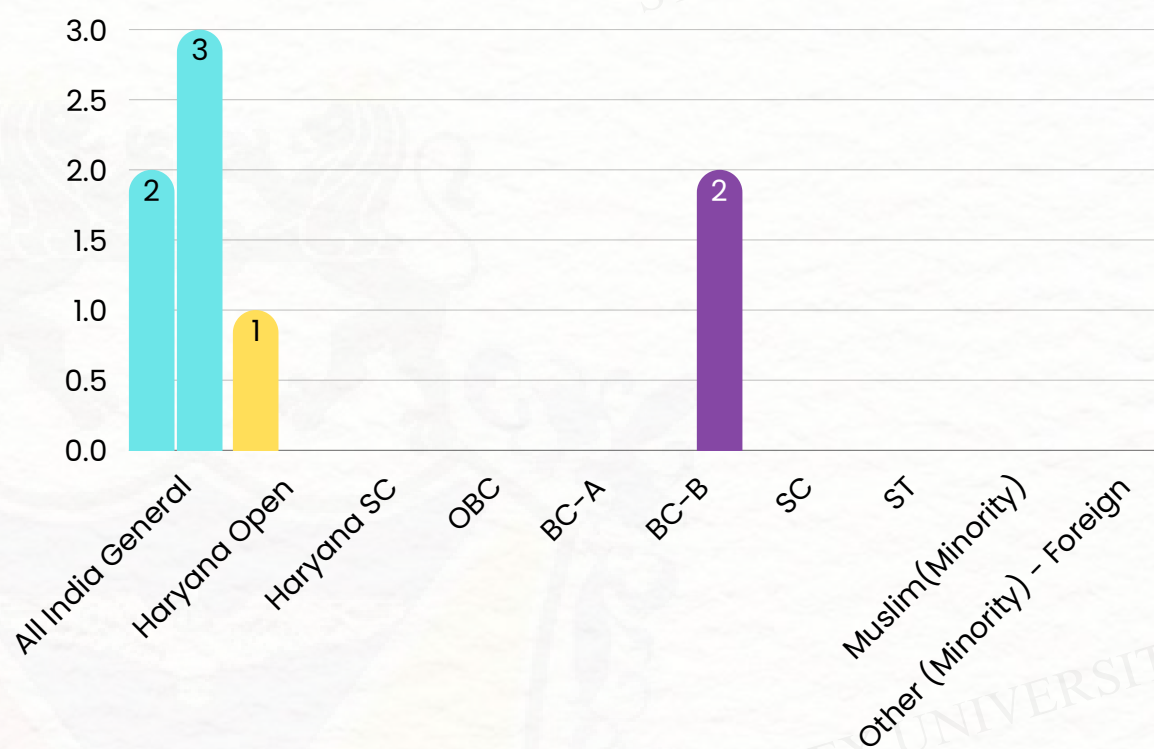

# EXAMINATION



The Examination Division of the University is charged with the responsibilities to conduct the End-Semester Examinations of all the programmes run by the University and monitoring the evaluation of the performance of the students in End-Semester Examinations, internal tests (Sessional Examinations), Projects, practical examinations, dissertations, viva-voce, campus extension programmes, filed work etc. and award of Degree/Diploma/Certificates.

The main responsibility of the Examination Division is to conduct the End-Semester Examinations of all the programmes run by the University and evaluation of their performance in terms of the provisions given in the Ordinance/Regulations through internal assessment and end-semester examinations. The End-Semester Examinations are held twice a year in the month of May and December or as per the academic calendar of the University. The Division issues the admit card to the students to take examinations as per the laid down eligibility criteria.

The Examination Division gets the evaluation of the answer books done through spot evaluation at the Examination Division. It also receives the awards of internal tests, projects, practical examinations, viva-voce etc from the faculty member concerned through the Head of the Department and processes them in terms of the laid down procedure of the relevant programme.

The Examination Division prepares the semester wise mark sheet indicating the SGPA and on completion of the programme with CGPA for all the programmes. The degree/Diploma/Certificate is also prepared and issued to the students as per the procedure of the University. 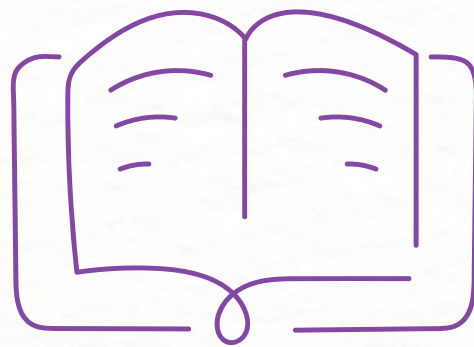

## School of Hotel Management

Hospitality education requires more than classroom instruction; it demands experiential learning that mirrors real-world industry practices. Students often struggle to connect theoretical concepts with practical applications, leading to gaps in skill development. School of Hotel Management initiated Experiential Learning through Hands-on Practice, Audio-Visual Pedagogy, and Theme-Based Events.

The goal of this practice is to enhance student learning by integrating practical exposure, modern teaching aids, and creative event-based pedagogy into the curriculum.

The practice is implemented through three interconnected strategies:

1. Practical Learning (Hands-on Practice)
2. Audio-Visual Learning
3. Theme Events

The Impact of this initiative was that

- Students demonstrated improved practical skills and confidence in handling real-world hospitality tasks.
- Theme events have attracted everyone, enhancing visibility and networking opportunities.

Overall, the practice had significantly contributed to employability, creativity, and industry readiness among students.

## School of Computer Science

Summer Internship on Web Design, UI/UX, and Data Analytics was organized with the collaboration with SKLZ TECT LLP, New Delhi.

The primary objective of this industry-integrated summer internship was to provide B.Tech and BCA students with hands-on exposure in Web Design, UI/UX, and Advanced Excel/Data Analytics through real-time project development.

Starex University introduced a structured, six-week summer internship for B.Tech. and BCA students in collaboration with SKLZ TECT LLP, New Delhi. The internship incorporated following specialized modules:

1. Web Design, UI/UX (DesignX) and,
2. Advanced Excel/Data Analytics (InsightX)

The internship witnessed active participation of nearly 70 students, demonstrating strong interest and engagement. Successful completion of real-time projects on advanced AI, design, and analytical topics served as clear evidence of the program's effectiveness. Students showcased functional prototypes, well-structured dashboards, and well-designed interfaces that reflected their learning outcomes.

## School of Pharmaceutical Science

Pharmacy education demands not only theoretical learning but also practical knowledge and innovation-based thinking. Traditional classroom teaching often limits student engagement and creative implementation of learning. To overcome this gap, the School of Pharmaceutical Sciences introduced a science exhibition on World Pharmacist Day.

On the day of the event, models were displayed across multiple stalls. Participants explained their concepts to faculty members, guests, and students from other departments. Some of the key themes included:

1. Molecule to drug process
2. Herbal formulations (such as chocolate and soap)
3. Cosmetic formulation ("Autumn Bliss")
4. Working heart model
5. Tablet manufacturing pilot plant
6. Air purifier (working model)

The exhibition successfully fulfilled its purpose of engaging students in applied pharmaceutical learning. Active participation from a large number of pharmacy students demonstrated the event's acceptance and relevance. The models presented showcased creativity, conceptual clarity, and scientific understanding, highlighting the learning outcomes achieved.

## School of Agriculture Science

Agriculture education requires hands-on exposure. Traditional classroom teaching alone is insufficient to prepare students for modern agricultural practices and rural realities.

Initiative by the School was “Learning by Doing: Integrating Classroom Teaching with Farm and Field Practices”

The Practice included:

1. Regular field visits to farms, KVKs, research stations, and agri-industries.
2. Maintenance of departmental instructional farm / demonstration plots.
3. Student participation in crop planning, sowing, irrigation, pest management, and harvesting.
4. Practical training on soil testing, seed treatment, composting, and organic farming.
5. Inclusion of case studies from local farming systems.

The Impact of this was:

1. Improved practical examination performance
2. Enhanced student confidence in fieldwork
3. Better placement and self-employment opportunities
4. Positive feedback from students and farmers

## School of Paramedical Science

Post-surgical patients—particularly those undergoing orthopedic procedures such as total knee replacement, total hip replacement, and spinal surgeries—often face prolonged immobility, pain, joint stiffness, decreased muscle strength, and increased risk of complications such as deep vein thrombosis and pulmonary issues.

To address these challenges, the Early Mobility Protocol was introduced as a structured, objective, and multidisciplinary approach by the Department of Physiotherapy.

The Early Mobility Protocol involves a structured physiotherapy program customized to each patient’s clinical condition, surgical procedure, and pain tolerance. The practice is initiated after postoperative vital-sign stability is ensured and surgical precautions are reviewed.

The implementation of the Early Mobility Protocol demonstrated significant improvements in recovery outcomes among postoperative patients. In an observational analysis conducted on more than 150 surgical cases, hospital stay duration was reduced by approximately 25–30%.

The Department of Paramedical Sciences initiated Structured Hospital Posting System with Continuous Monitoring for Paramedical Students.

The objective of this ongoing practice is to ensure that students of the School of Paramedical Sciences receive structured, competency-based clinical exposure as required in their curriculum.

Key goals include:

- Providing hands-on, skill-based clinical learning.
- Maintaining discipline through daily attendance verification.
- Strengthening communication between faculty and hospital supervisors.
- Ensuring authentic documentation of clinical work through logbooks.
- Evaluating competencies via viva-voce and logbook assessment at the end of postings.

This practice enhances experiential learning and prepares students for professional clinical responsibilities.

This long-standing practice has shown consistently positive outcomes. These were:

- Attendance compliance increased significantly because of the daily signature system.
- Logbooks reflect genuine hands-on learning.
- External examiners appreciated the depth of clinical understanding during viva examinations.
- Supervisors reported improved discipline, punctuality, and confidence among students.
- Students who completed postings regularly performed better in practical exams and internal assessments.

This demonstrates that even without an on-campus hospital, the department ensures training quality comparable to institutions with full clinical setups.

## School of Humanities

Within the university setting, students often face academic pressure, examinations, career uncertainty, and social challenges, while faculty and staff encounter workload demands, multitasking, and work-life imbalance. These stressors can lead to burnout, reduced productivity, and emotional distress.

The School of Humanities implemented this practice through a combination of professional psychological counselling sessions and structured stress-management programs. Counselling is delivered by faculty experts via one-on-one sessions, group therapy, and interactive workshops. These sessions focus on identifying stressors, exploring thought patterns, and developing personalized coping strategies.

### **Stress management techniques include:**

1. Mindfulness meditation and relaxation exercises.
2. Cognitive-behavioral approaches.
3. Lifestyle modifications such as balanced nutrition, physical activity, and time management.

Implementation begins with awareness campaigns across the university to reduce stigma and encourage participation. Confidentiality and trust are emphasized to ensure students and staff feels safe sharing personal concerns.

Unique aspects of this practice include integration of counselling with stress-management workshops, tailoring interventions to specific groups (students, faculty, or staff), and offering hybrid support.

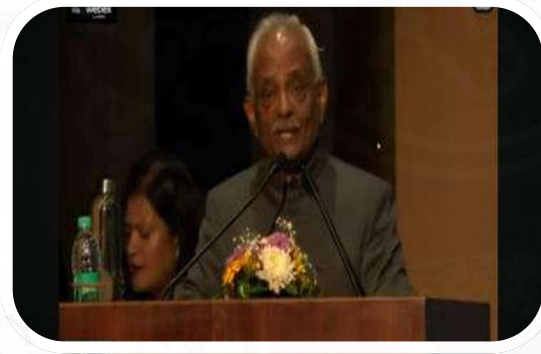

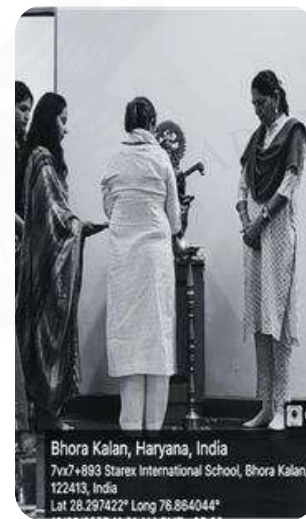

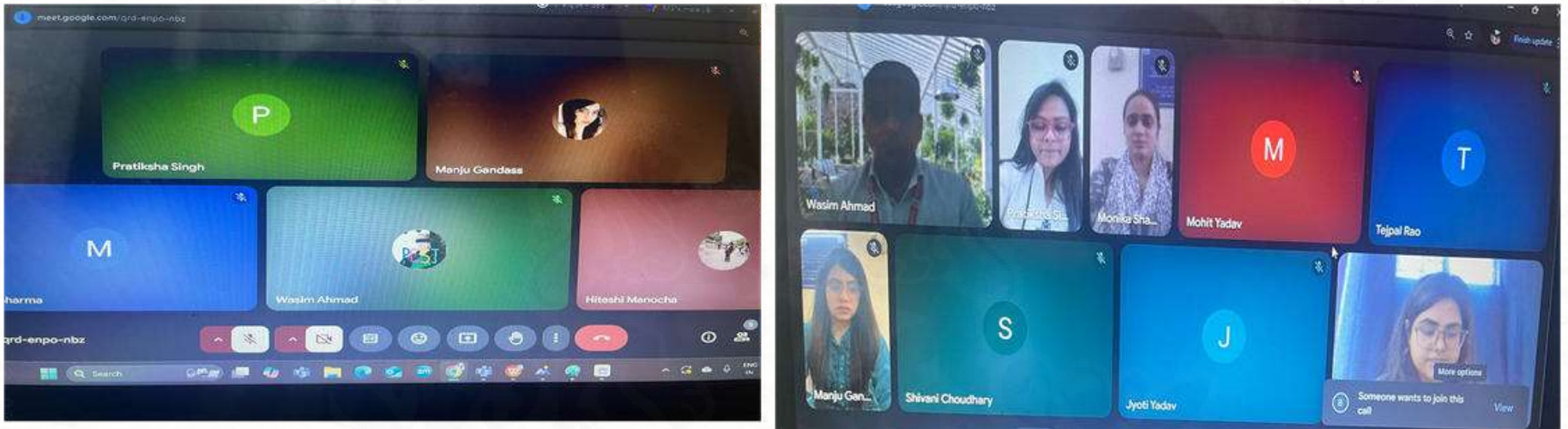

### Report on the audit of the Financial Statements

#### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Financial Statements of **Starex Foundation** ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2025 and the Statement of Profit and Loss and Statement of Cash Flows for the year ended on that date, and notes to the Financial Statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

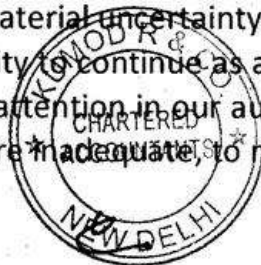
The Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.





#### 1 Significant accounting policies

##### a Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared and presented under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis of accounting except for certain financial instruments which are measured at fair values and comply with the Accounting Standards prescribed by Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006, as amended, other pronouncements of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956, (the Act") to the extent applicable.

##### b Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the generally accepted accounting principles ('GAAP') in India requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of income and expenses of the period, assets and liabilities and disclosures relating to contingent liabilities as of the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognised prospectively in future periods.

##### c Revenue Recognition

Revenue from sale of goods is recognized on transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership to the customer and when no significant uncertainty exists regarding realization of the consideration. Sales are recorded net of sales returns, rebates and trade discounts and price differences.

**Interest :** Interest on bank deposits is recognised on accrual basis.

**Dividends :** Revenue is recognised when the shareholders' right to receive payment is established by the balance sheet date. Dividend from subsidiaries is recognised even if same are declared after the balance sheet date but pertains to period on or before the date of balance sheet as per the requirement of schedule VI of the Companies Act, 1956

##### d Fixed Assets And Depreciation

i) Fixed assets are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation. Cost comprises the purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use. Financing costs relating to acquisition of fixed assets are also included to the extent they relate to the period till such assets are ready to be put to use.

ii) Depreciation is provided using the Straight - line method as per the useful lives of the assets estimated by the management, or at the rates prescribed under Schedule XIV of the Companies Act, 1956, whichever is higher.

**Intangibles** Software is stated at cost of acquisition and includes all attributable cost of bringing software to its working condition for its intended use.

##### e Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost and net realizable value. costs include freight taxes duties and appropriate production overheads and are generally ascertained on the first in First out (FIFO) basis.

##### m Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the year are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.


