# **Authorities of the University**

## **Officers of the University**

### **Visitor**

The Governor of Haryana is the Visitor of the University.

### **Chancellor**

The Chancellor of the University is appointed for a period of three years by the Sponsoring Body with the approval of the Visitor.

### **Vice Chancellor**

The Vice Chancellor is appointed by the Chancellor, as per qualification prescribed by the University Grants Commission, subject to the provisions contained in sub-section 17 (1) and shall hold office for a term of three years or up to the age of 70 years, whichever is earlier, provided that after expiry of the term of 3 years, the Vice Chancellor shall be eligible for re-appointment for another term of 3 years.

### **Registrar**

The appointment of Registrar is made by the Chairperson of the sponsoring body in such manner, as may be specified by the Statutes. The Registrar shall possess the qualifications prescribed by the University Grants Commission.

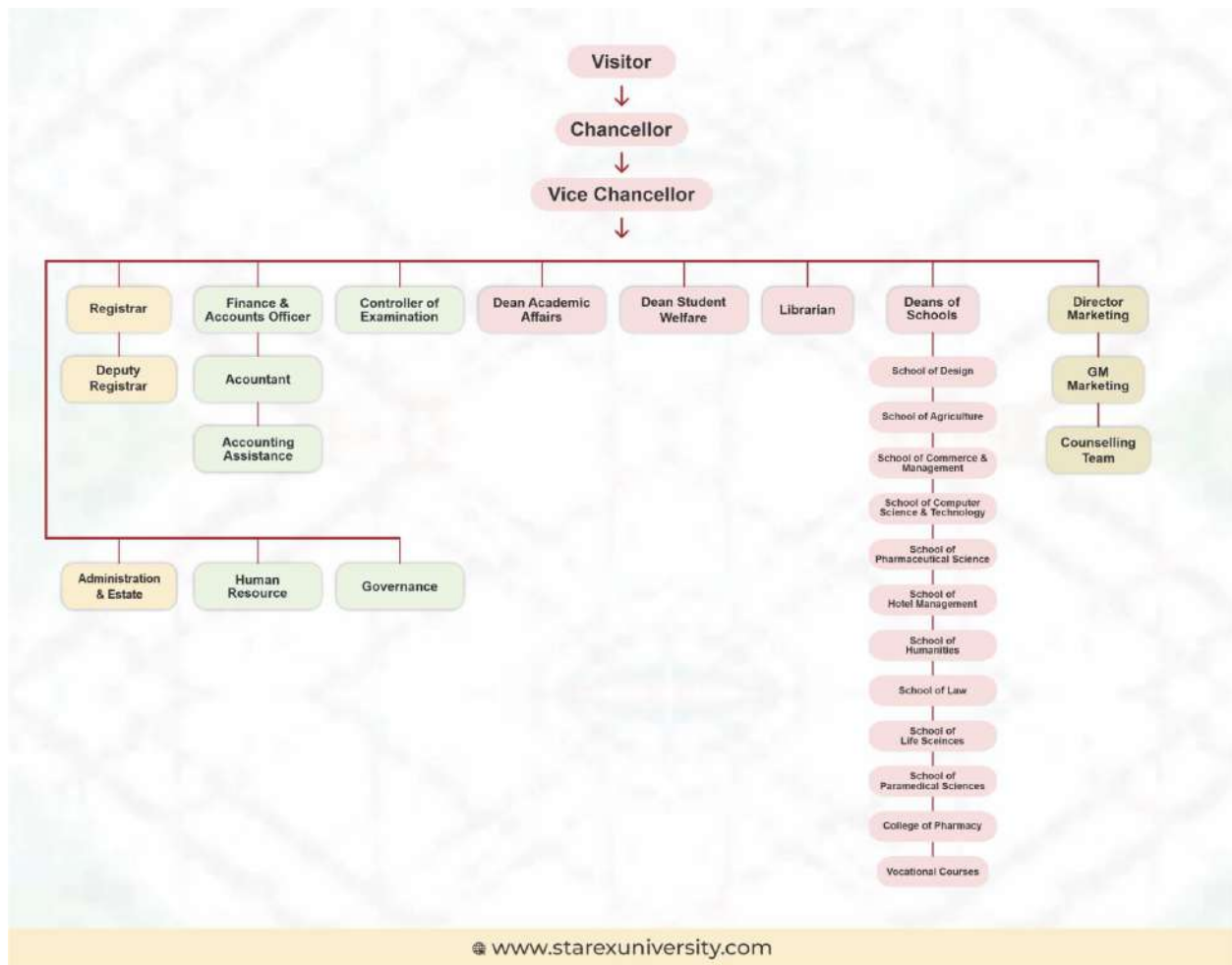
### **Chief Finance and Account Officer**

The Chief Finance and Account Officer is appointed by the Chancellor under Section 19(1) of the Act. He/She is the whole time salaried officer of the University.

### **Controller of Examination**

There is a Controller of Examinations who is the whole time salaried officer. He/ She must possess the requisite qualifications and experience. The Controller of Examinations shall be appointed by the Chancellor.

## Governing Body

The Governing Body is the supreme authority of the university. All the movable and immovable property of the university shall vest in the Governing Body.

The Governing Body consist of following members:

- The Chancellor - Chairperson
- The Vice-Chancellor
- The Secretary to Government, Haryana, Education Department, or in his absence, Director, Higher Education, Haryana;
- Five persons nominated by the Starex Foundation out of whom two shall be eminent educationists;
- One expert of Management or Technology from outside the university, nominated by the Chancellor; and
- One expert of Finance, nominated by the Chancellor.

The Governing Body shall meet at least three times in each calendar year. The quorum of the meetings of the Governing Body shall be four, provided that the Secretary to Government, Haryana, and Education Department or in his absence, Director, Higher Education shall be present in each meeting in which decisions on issues involving government policies/instructions are to be taken up.

## **Academic Council**

The Academic Council is the Supreme Academic Body of the University. The Academic Council shall, subject to the provisions of the Haryana Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations and Rules have the control over and be responsible for the maintenance of standards of education, teaching and training, inter-departmental co-ordination, research, examinations and tests within the University, co-ordinate and exercise general supervision over the academic policy of the University exercise such other powers and perform such other duties and functions as may be prescribed or conferred upon it by the Statutes.

The Academic Council shall consist of the following members:-

- The Vice Chancellor as Chair;
- The Pro-Vice Chancellors;
- The Controller of Examinations;
- The Deans of Schools of the University;
- Librarian
- Two Professors or Associate Professors and one Assistant Professor from each School to be elected by the faculty of the respective School;
- Three educationists of repute or distinguished persons from any other field related to the activities of the University who are not in the service of the University, nominated by the Chancellor; and
- Three persons who are not in the service of the University and who are nominated by the Chancellor for their specialized knowledge.

The Registrar shall be the Secretary of the Academic Council but not a member of the Council.

## **2. Planning Board**

The Planning Board is the Principal Planning Body of the University.

The Constitution of the Board consists of the following members:-

- a. The Chancellor – Chairperson
- b. The Vice Chancellor - Member
- c. One Dean or Director to be nominated by the Chancellor as Member
- d. One Professor from each Faculty to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor as Members
- e. Two members to be nominated by the Chancellor, one from the Industry & other from the academia as Members.
- f. The Registrar shall be the Member-Secretary of the Planning Board but shall not have a right to vote.

## **3. Admission Committee**

The University shall constitute an Admission Committee under the direction of the Chancellor.

The Committee consists of the following members:-

- a. The Chancellor as Chairman;

- b. The Vice Chancellor as Member;
- c. The Pro Vice Chancellor as Member;
- d. The registrar shall be the Member-Secretary of the Admission Committee but shall not have a right to vote.
- e. Principal(s)/ Director(s) as Member(s)
- f. Respective Faculty Deans as Members
- g. One officer of the Academic Department nominated by the Vice Chancellor

#### **4. Examination Committee**

There is an Examination Committee under the Chairmanship of Vice Chancellor.

The Examination Committee consists of the following members:-

- Vice Chancellor as Chairman- Ex-officio;
- Pro-Vice Chancellor(s) as Vice Chairman;
- The Controller of Examination as Member Secretary; - Ex- Officio
- One Professor from each Faculty as Members
- Asst. COE as Member- Ex- Officio
- One official/officer nominated by the Vice Chancellor, if need be

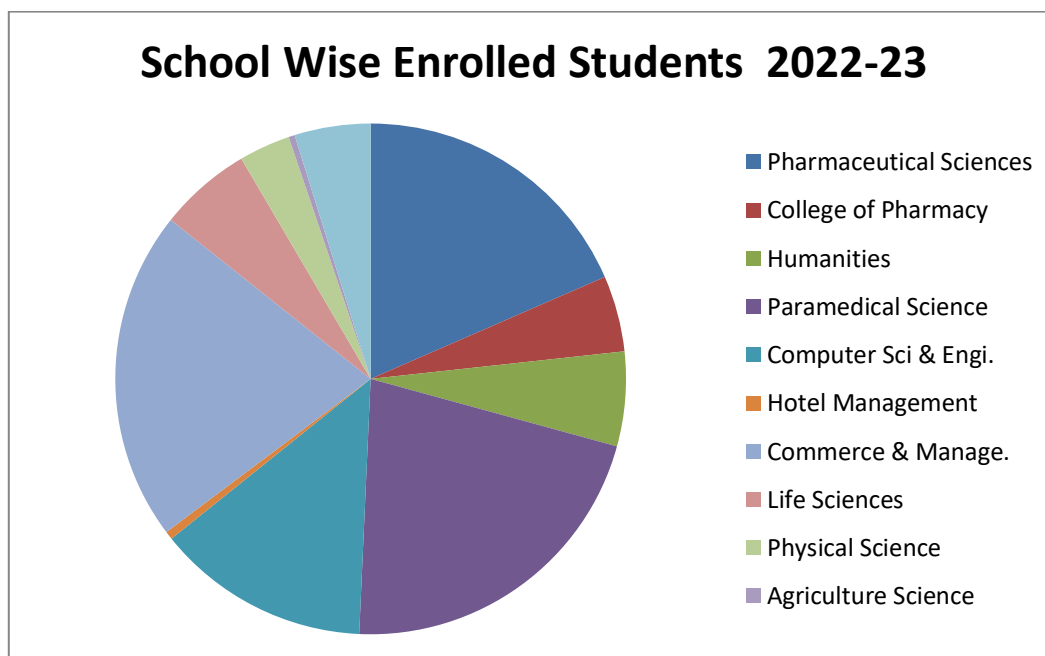
## School Wise Enrolment

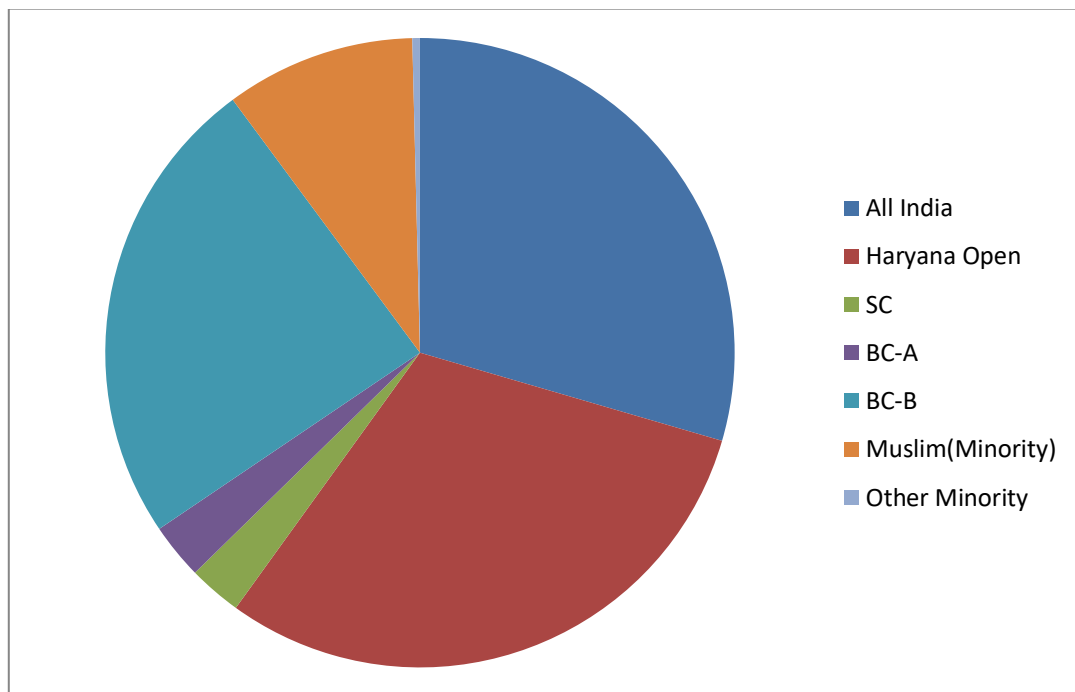


Figure 3: Category Wise Enrolment

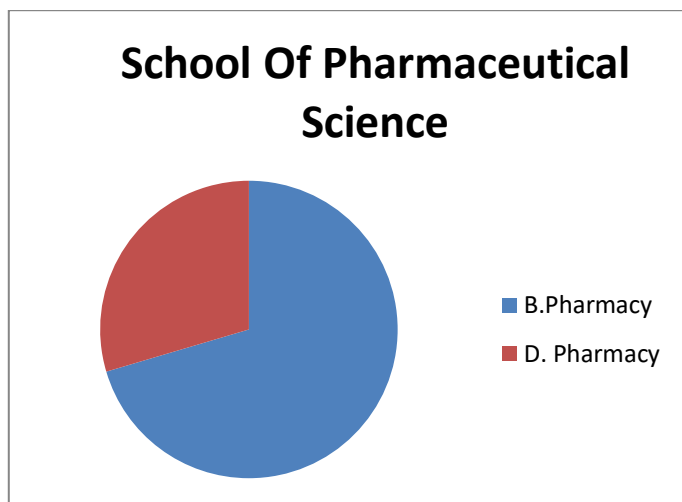


Figure 4: Enrolment in School of Pharmaceutical Sciences

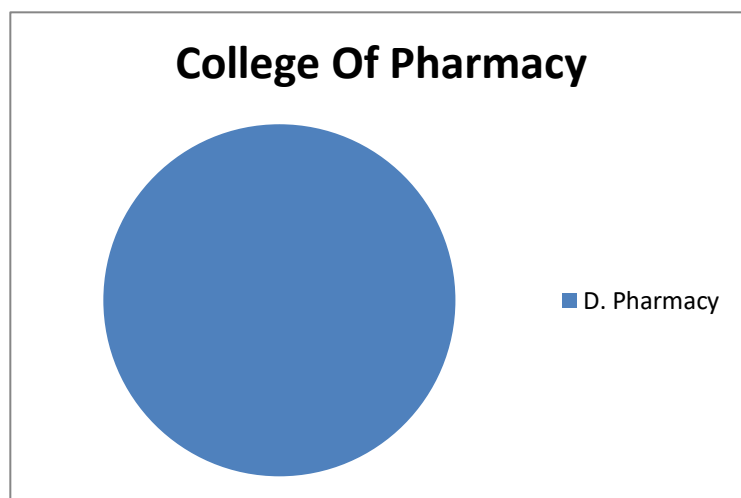


Figure 5 : Enrolment in College of Pharmacy

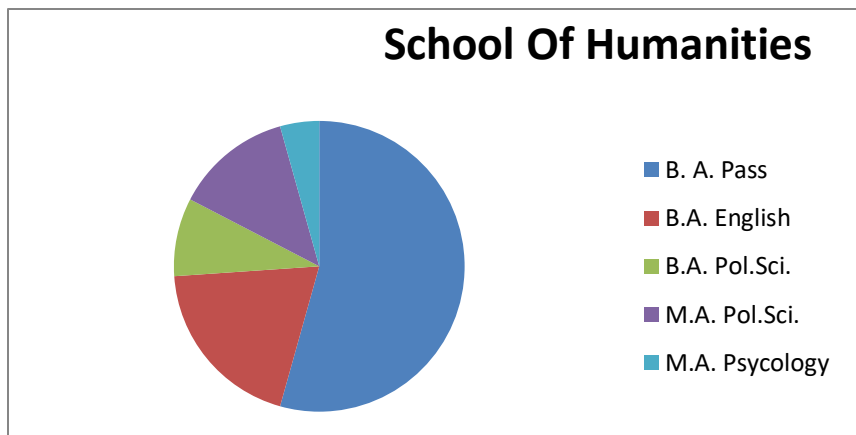


Figure 6: Enrolment in School of Humanities

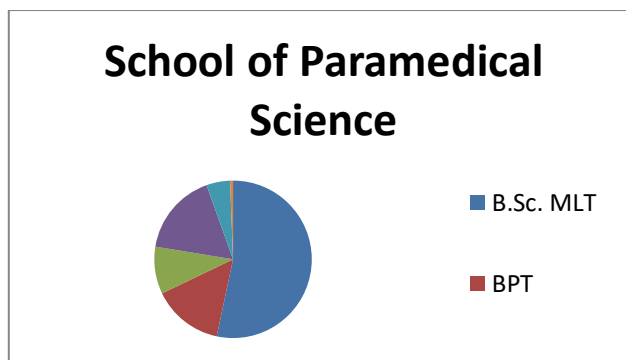


Figure 7: Enrolment in School of Paramedical Sciences

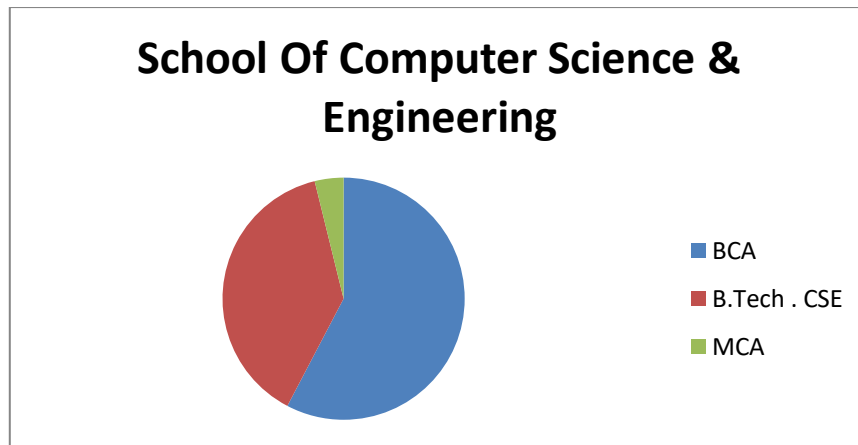


Figure 8: Enrolment in School of Computer Science and Engineering

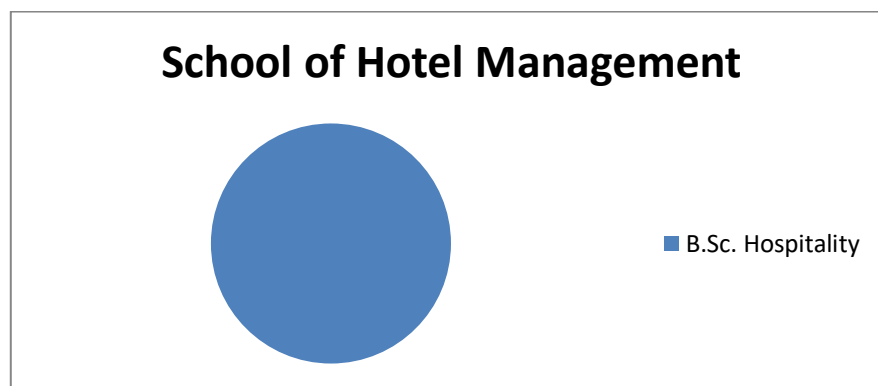


Figure 9: Enrolment in School of Hotel Management

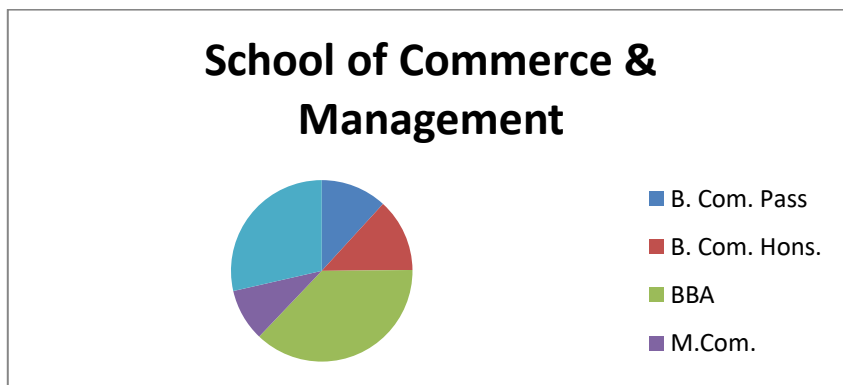


Figure 10: Enrolment in School of Commerce and Management

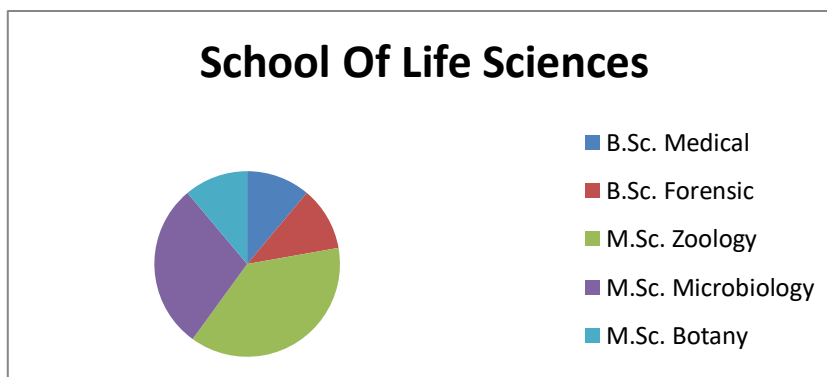
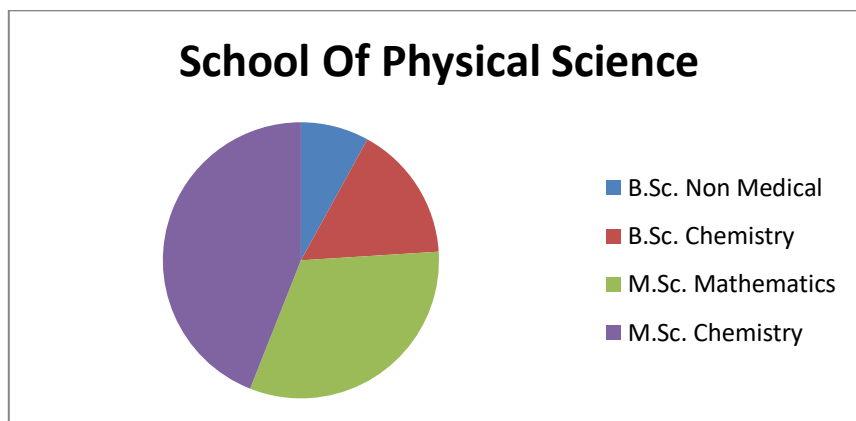


Figure 11: Enrolment in School of Life Sciences

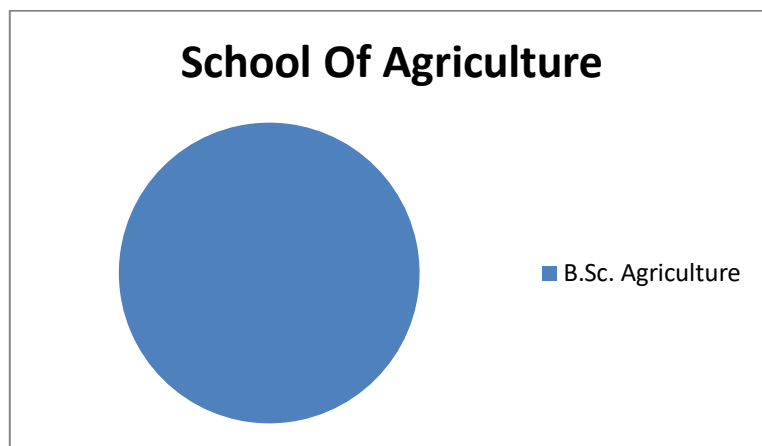

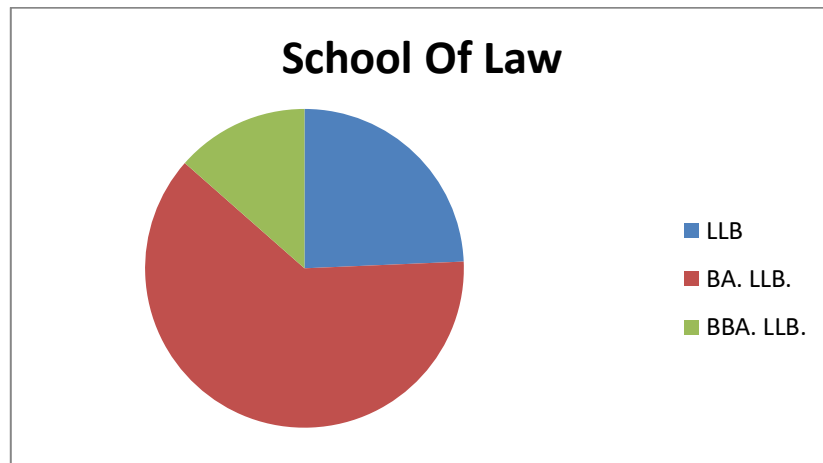

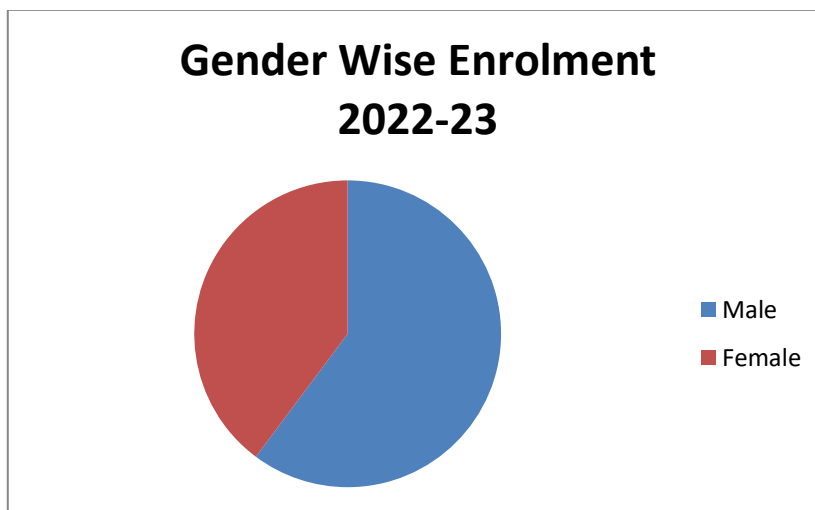


**Figure 14: Enrolment in School of Law**

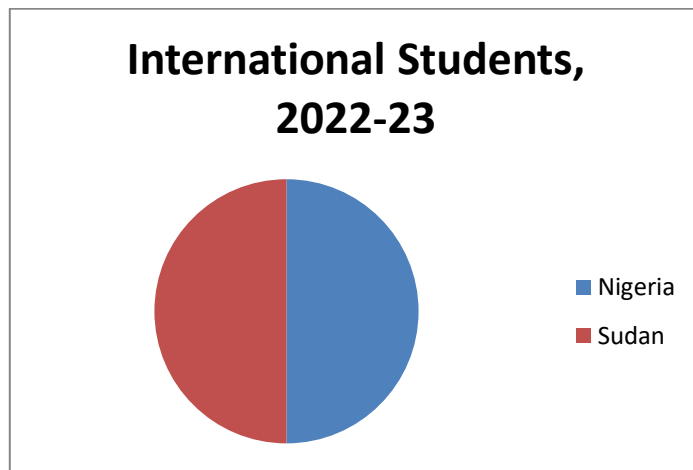

This is to bring to your kind knowledge that the Standing Committee of Legal Education Committee of Bar Council of India by virtue of its meeting held on 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> April, 2022 considered the matter of School of Law, Starex University, Gurgaon, Haryana.


School of Law, Starex University, Gurugram, Haryana has approval for two sections each of five year BA LLB (Hons) and five year BBA LLB (Hons) with intake of 60 students in each section up to the academic session 2020-21. Thereafter, CLE was inspected for extension of approval for the existing courses as well as for fresh approval for three year LLB course with intake of Two Sections.


While dealing with the matter, the Standing Committee at its meeting held on 30/31/10.2021 observed inter-alia that the existing strength does not justify the extension of approval for certain sections. It was further made clear that it is for the CLE to take decision in its behalf, either to can surrender one or two sections of Five-year B.A.L.L.B. or B.B.A.L.L.B. course and in

section. In view of this observation, the Registrar addressed a letter dated 20.12.2021 offering to surrender one section of 5-year BBA LLB(H) course and proposing to start one section of three year LLB course. The request is acceded to and approval for one section of five year BBA LLB (H) course is withdrawn and the approval of affiliation is accorded for one section of three year LL.Bcourse.

## Library

The Mahatma Budh Central Library is sanctum sanctorum of Starex University. The structure of the Library building has been designed by a reputed German architect. It is the seat of knowledge for the students, research scholars, the entire learned faculty and other staff members.

## Alumni

Other expected goals are to support poor and needy students in the nearby villages for their education, to conduct seminars, conferences, workshops and meetings of various professionals and faculties for the purpose of promotion of knowledge and skill. To advise and interact with State and Central Government Bodies, Universities, Professional Associations, Manufacturing Industries and Marketing Agencies on matters relating to promotion of education and training.

During 2022-2023, Alumni meet was conducted in the Hall of the Research and Innovation Cell. For this more than 400 students filled the registration form (including hard copies as well as Google forms). On the day of meet, 122 students also filled the feedback form designed for their suggestion and experience about the meet. An entry register was also prepared (which includes detailed information of alumni students, who participated physically in the first meet) on the day of the meet as a record.

The program was inaugurated with the lighting of the lamp by the Pro-Vice Chancellor Prof. (Dr.) Ashok Diwaker and other authorities of the University. Total 124 students participated in the 1<sup>st</sup> alumni meet.

The outcome of the event was that the pass out students got an opportunity to have get-together with the faculty, administration and staff. There were many alumni students present in the meet who are doing very well in their respective fields/job. Such students said that they are assets of the university and they are always ready to support the university and presently studying students at their best level. So by this meet such pass out students were identified who may be helpful in the career development of the presently studying students.

## ICT Infrastructure

2022-23 was a busy year for IT Department. IT Department made major upgrades to the university's digital infrastructure, including installing fiber optic connectivity to connect major locations on the campus. This high-speed backbone allows for seamless communication and collaboration between locations. We have also enhanced the network monitoring tools to keep a close eye on performance and security. Another big project was transitioning our CCTV surveillance system to a state-of-the-art IP platform. The new system provides an easily managed and robust platform to help keep the campus safe. On the wireless side, we expanded Wi-Fi coverage across the university to minimize dead zones and ensure reliable access everywhere. Finally, we migrated our staff and faculty emails to G Suite, bringing the power of Google services to our university domain. Though each project presented its own challenges, we systematically tackled them one by one to modernize our IT capabilities. Our infrastructure is now positioned to support the university's needs today and is ready for future up gradation.

Campus is covered with high speed indoor and outdoor Wi-Fi access points, smart cameras surveillance with IP cameras throughout the campus.

## Examination

The Examination Division of the University is charged with the responsibilities to conduct the End-Semester Examinations of all the programmes run by the University and monitoring the evaluation of the performance of the students in End-Semester Examinations, internal tests (Sessional Examinations) , Projects, practical examinations, dissertations, viva-voce, campus extension programmes, filed work etc. and award of Degree/Diploma/Certificates.

The main responsibility of the Examination Division is to conduct the End-Semester Examinations of all the programmes run by the University and evaluation of their performance in terms of the provisions given in the Ordinance/Regulations through internal assessment and end-semester examinations. The End-Semester Examinations are held twice a year in the month of May and December or as per academic calendar of the University. The Division issues the admit card to the students to take examinations as per the laid down eligibility criteria.

The Examination Division gets the evaluation of the answer books done through spot evaluation at the Examination Division. It also receives the awards of internal tests, projects, practical examinations, viva-voce etc from the faculty member concerned through the Head of the Department and processes them in terms of the laid down procedure of the relevant programme.

The Examination Division prepares the semester wise mark sheet indicating the SGPA and on completion of programme with CGPA for all the programmes. The degree/Diploma/Certificate is also prepared and issued to the students as per the procedure of the University. Detail of conduct of Examinations and Pass Percentage of Students during the year 2022-23 is given in table 7.

## Notes forming part of Financial Statements

### 1 Significant accounting policies

#### a Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared and presented under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis of accounting except for certain financial instruments which are measured at fair values and comply with the Accounting Standards prescribed by Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006, as amended, other pronouncements of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956, (the Act) to the extent applicable.

#### b Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the generally accepted accounting principles ('GAAP') in India requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of income and expenses of the period, assets and liabilities and disclosures relating to contingent liabilities as of the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognised prospectively in future periods.

#### c Revenue Recognition

Revenue from sale of goods is recognized on transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership to the customer and when no significant uncertainty exists regarding realization of the consideration. Sales are recorded net of sales returns, rebates and trade discounts and price differences.

**Interest :** Interest on bank deposits is recognised on accrual basis.

**Dividends :** Revenue is recognised when the shareholders' right to receive payment is established by the balance sheet date. Dividend from subsidiaries is recognised even if same are declared after the balance sheet date but pertains to period on or before the date of balance sheet as per the requirement of schedule VI of the Companies Act, 1956

#### d Fixed Assets And Depreciation

i) Fixed assets are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation. Cost comprises the purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use. Financing costs relating to acquisition of fixed assets are also included to the extent they relate to the period till such assets are ready to be put to use.

ii) Depreciation is provided using the Straight - line method as per the useful lives of the assets estimated by the management, or at the rates prescribed under Schedule XIV of the Companies Act, 1956, whichever is higher.

**Intangibles** Software is stated at cost of acquisition and includes all attributable cost of bringing software to its working condition for its intended use.

#### e Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost and net realizable value. costs include freight taxes duties and appropriate production overheads and are generally ascertained on the first in First out (FIFO) basis.

#### m Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the year are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

## SELECTION CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

Admission to various courses of the University will be made as per the following guidelines prescribed by and under section 35 of Haryana Private Universities Act-2006, as amended up-to-date.

(A) Admission in the University will be made strictly on the basis of merit.

(B) Merit for admission in the University may be determined either on the basis of marks or grades obtained in the entrance test conducted by the University/Association of Universities / by any authorized agency or the marks obtained in the qualifying examination. However, the admission in professional and technical courses will be made only through an entrance test as prescribed under Subsection 2 of section 35 of the Act.

(C) Furthermore, unfilled/drop-out vacant seats in professional and technical courses will be filled by the University at its own level by considering the marks obtained by the applicant in the qualifying examination and on the basis of their inter-se-merit.

- (5) If the student applies for cancellation of admission at any stage of his/her study, refund of fees will be permissible as per rules of University Grants Commission, New Delhi/ Starex University.
- (6) If a Foreign Student desires to leave Starex University and like to join another university of his choice, in that case, it will be the discretion of the university management whether to give NOC or not.
